 - All students should submit the same number of photos (number to be decided at the appropriate Graduation Committee Meeting)

For Yearbook Only:

- **Activity Photos**
 - Any GCCHSA activity during the high school years

8th-Graders

For Yearbook:

- **Personal Candid Photos**
 - Photos from birth through present
 - Usually up to 8 photos, depending on the size of the 8th-grade class, for one page in the Yearbook
 - All students should submit the same number of photos (number to be decided at the appropriate Graduation Committee Meeting)
- **Activity Photos**
 - Any GCCHSA activity in junior high school years

For Display Board Collage/PowerPoint Presentation:

- **Personal Candid Photos**
 - Photos from birth through present
 - Usually up to 8 photos, depending on the size of the 8th-grade class, for PowerPoint (all students should submit the same number of photos)
 - Unlimited number of photos for Display Board
 - May include photos of family and friends, sports events, hobbies and interests, etc. for Display Board
